The Legend of the Gentle Miller


This story shows that gnomes, although they generally hide from humans, area always ready to help them when they're in need. These little guys truly do have big hearts. Really, really big!

Elves wear scarlet or green outfits and a cute hat made from the corolla of a flower, decorated with tiny jingling bells.


In addition to the woodland elves, who inhabit the world's oldest forests, there are elves of darkness and elves of light.
